## Description

**Cpl John Alexander FRENCH** (1914-1942) VC recipient, was typical of many single young men who had enlisted early in the war. He went on to serve in Britain, Egypt, and Libya with the 2/9<sup>th</sup> Battalion. By the time that he was sent to Papua in August 1942, he was an experienced infantry non-commissioned officer (NCO).

On the afternoon of 4th September, Cpl French's company came across Japanese positions near Goroni and was held up by intense fire from three machine-gun posts. Ordering his own section to take cover, French successfully assaulted two positions with grenades. He then attacked the third with a sub-machine gun but finally fell dead in front of the enemy gun pit. He is buried in the Port Moresby (Bomana) War Cemetery Grave A2. E. 16.
